Reuben Dip

If you like a grilled Reuben sandwich, you'll love this warm cheesy spread. It's wonderful on party rye bread or crackers.



Ingredients

Package (8 Oz.) Cream Cheese, Softened
½ Cup Sour Cream
2 Tablespoons Ketchup
½ Pound Deli Corned Beef, Finely Chopped
1 Cup Sauerkraut, Chopped, Rinsed And Drained
1 Cup (4 Ounces) Shredded Swiss Cheese
2 Tablespoons Finely Chopped Onion
Snack Rye Bread Or Crackers

Directions

In a bowl, beat cream cheese, sour cream and ketchup until smooth.

Stir in the corned beef, sauerkraut, swiss cheese and onion until blended.

Transfer to a greased 1-qt. baking dish. cover and bake at 375° for 30 minutes. Uncover; bake 5 minutes longer or until bubbly.

Serve warm with bread or crackers. Yield: 3 cups
